As another Spring Baseball Season has passed, vacations are being taken and school preparations are starting it's a good time to reflect on some of the highlights and introduce some events coming up in the Fall of 2005.

NJJBA boasted impressive growth among our programs including our base 9 through 14 year-old leagues, 8-and-Under programs and our High School aged Level III and Seniors programs. Perhaps our biggest accomplishment this year however was the inception of a T-Ball Program for our 4 and 5 year-olds. The response to the offering was impressive and positions us to provide our services to even more youth in the Arvada and Westminster areas.

Heading into the Fall, we're excited once again to offer our Fall Ball Program to the youth of our area and surrounding metros. Fall Ball gives players and teams an opportunity to stay sharp, hone their skills further, experience positions that may not have been played during the Spring season and extend their seasons on the dirt before they turn to snow and ice. All ages are again invited to participate in Fall Ball, including the little tykes interested in T-Ball!

In 2004, NJJBA moved some tryouts from the Spring to the Fall. This allowed teams to begin planning early, know where they stand when the Spring season rolls around and gives kids the opportunity to tryout for that higher level or simply tryout to move to other teams. While in 2004, we limited those tryouts to specific ages and levels; in 2005 we'll be offering those tryouts to all 10 through 14-Year-olds and all levels of play. The weather cooperates better in the Fall so I'd like to encourage everyone who's interested in entering the tryouts to do so this Fall to get the best look possible from the Coaches looking to draft players. There's more information in this Newsletter about the Fall Tryouts as well as the Player Registration options available.

Also coming up, I will be hosting an "NJJBA Town Hall Meeting". The purpose of which is to hear from you, our members, concerning potential or live issues that you're faced with in Youth Baseball. The Board of Directors will be present to listen and discuss potential changes to how we operate, Rules and Regulation modifications, age cutoff changes, suggestions for improvement or any other feedback you'd like to present in an open forum. If you'd like to make an impact and help shape the direction of NJJBA, I'd encourage you to attend. The meeting is open to all parents, coaches and players. I sincerely hope you enjoyed a positive and worthwhile Spring season with NJJBA and I wish you continued enjoyment as we move into the Fall and beyond.

NJJBA FALL BALL PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The NJJBA Fall Baseball Program is designed to give players a program to **continue playing baseball in the Fall months of September and October**. Typically, players will play in the age group that they plan to play in the following Spring. As with previous years, NJJBA will offer Fall baseball for all age groups and abilities.

The Fall baseball program includes **Tee Ball, an 8-and-Under Machine Pitch program, and the 8-14 Kid pitch groups**. Games are scheduled to begin the second Sunday in September (September 11) and run for eight weeks through the last Sunday in October (October 30).

Fall Baseball is a great time to **learn new skills, try new positions, and bring teams together for continuing instruction through the Fall months**. Fall Baseball is the "Spring Training" of Little League baseball, but with better weather. Teams usually meet an hour before game time on Sundays for warm-up and instruction; any other practices during the week are at the discretion of the coach and the team. This works well for those who play football or participate in other sports in the fall. **Make plans now to continue the development and training of your players.**

The Fall program is an excellent time to come out to the ballpark with great weather and play in a relaxed atmosphere. **We encourage entire teams or parts of teams to play together and continue their training into the Fall. There will be discounts for full team registration so begin making plans today to get your kids registered.** This Fall, we expect teams and players from many parts of Jefferson County. We have fielded teams and players in past years from Arvada, Golden, Lakewood, Broomfield, Westminster, Thornton, Wheat Ridge, Bear Creek, and Denver. We will have multiple teams in each age group so that teams don't play the "same teams" every week. **We are open to all other Associations and welcome players from those organizations** so that they can continue their development with North Jefferson Junior Baseball in the Fall.

We are looking forward to continued success this Fall and keeping the momentum and training of the players going into next year. Fall baseball acts as a spring board for those training in the Winter with their teams, or those playing at a new level next Spring. **NJJBA is an outstanding organization dedicated to the teaching, development, and growth of our children.** Please continue to be a part of this organization and enroll your child today.

Fall Ball Frequently Asked Questions

What age groups can play baseball in the Fall?

All age groups are welcome including Tee Ball (4-5), Machine Pitch (5-8) and Kid Pitch (8-14 year olds) Leagues. Players normally play in the age group that they plan to play in the Spring/Summer of 2006. Therefore, an 8 year old now, who's playing age next Spring is 9, will play on a 9-year old kid pitch team in the Fall.

What days will games be played?

Games are played every Sunday starting the second Sunday in Sept (Sept 11) and run every Sunday through Oct 30, weather permitting. Typically there will be no make-ups.

What is the cost per player for the program?

Prices are \$50/player for Tee Ball and Machine pitch and \$85/player for Kid Pitch. Entire teams signing up (9 or more players) will receive a "Team Discount"



Where are games played and what time do they start?

Games are normally played at Pioneer Park in Arvada and can start at 12:00noon, 2:00pm and 4:00pm on those Sundays. If we have a larger number of teams this year, we may have games at other parks, and an earlier start time, but more than likely, most games will be at Pioneer Park. Tee Ball and Machine Pitch may be at another park, but we won't know that until the middle to end of August after registration has completed.



How many games can we expect to play during the Fall?

We have 8 Sundays of baseball in those two months, so we hope to get the 8 games in, but last year we had some teams get 10 games in and others got 6 games in. We won't do make-ups unless we have too many "weather outs"

Are there practices during the week?

Practices are up to the coaches and the teams. Most Fall Teams just practice an hour before the games on Sunday, but some may have a practice during the week. We won't schedule practice fields in the Fall for the teams, so it is up to the coach if they want a practice during the week. In the past, many of the kids play football, soccer and hockey during the Fall so most teams just conduct a pre-game warm-up then play the game.

Are the rules different in the Fall?

Rules are basically the same as the Spring/Summer, but we do have some modifications such as limiting the innings a player may pitch or catch. Also, we don't keep standings, but do keep score, and use registered umpires in the kid pitch games.

How, when, and where do we register our kids for the program?

Registration starts at the end of July with online registration on the North Jeff website (www.njjba.org) and there will be multiple walk-in registration days at the North Jeff Indoor Facility in August. Those dates will be posted on the North Jeff website under the "Calendar" section. Tentatively, they are scheduled for 08/10, 08/13, 08/17, 08/20, 08/24, and 08/28. The walk-in registration will take place at the NJJBA Indoor Facility, commonly referred to as the IPF. The NJJBA Indoor Practice Facility is located at 9374 West 58th Avenue, just east of Ace Hardware in the Arvada Plaza Shopping Center.

What uniforms do the kids wear?

NJJBA will provide a T-shirt/jersey for each player, and each team will have the same color according to the High School area team they are assigned to play on. Players may use any cap and baseball pants that they want wear, and other personal baseball uniform should be worn (i.e.: sliding shorts, protective cup, long socks, and baseball cleats)

What if our team has never played with NJJBA and we have a team that wants to play together this Fall?

If you have a coach who wants to coach the Fall team and have kids who want to play for that coach, they will be set up so that they all play together. We will add players to your team if you have fewer than 12, but you can keep those kids together who want to play for a specific coach. All new coaches are required to submit a coaches' application and agree to a background check.

Are Aluminum bats allowed in the Fall baseball league?

Yes, any bats can be used in the Fall League.

AGE CUTOFF CHANGE COMING!

Beginning with Fall Ball and Fall Tryouts, there will be a change to the date for what we use to determine a players 'playing age'. In following with National sanctioning bodies such as USSSA and Triple Crown, JCJBL and NJJBA will be implementing this new cutoff date.

The New Age Cutoff to determine player eligibility will be: May 1

This change basically means that, in comparison to the old cutoff date, all players previously eligible for an age division will still be eligible, however players born in May, June, and July will also now qualify for a "younger" age division than they did in the past. Example: To play in the 12-Year-Old division, a player must be no older than 12-years-old through April 30 of that rostering season.

All new registration documents will reflect this new cutoff date. If unsure how this will affect your player/team, please come to the NJJBA Town Hall Meeting or contact your Area Vice President!

NJJBA FALL TRYOUTS FOR 2006 SEASON

Fall tryouts will be starting in September. Throughout the years we have traditionally held tryouts in the spring. As we have all enjoyed the snow, wind and bone chilling temperatures at times, we have decided to hold tryouts for the upcoming season in the Fall. Now we all know that we can get that first snow storm around September 1st, but we typically have better than average weather. Don't forget to dress appropriately. For those who will be 9-year-old players or Roberto Clemente, tryouts will remain in the spring. All Fall tryouts will be held at Pioneer park at 80th and Simms.

2006 PLAYER OPTIONS

NJJBA offers four skill levels of baseball played in a competitive environment. All of our teams are USSSA sanctioned, and if qualified can play in state, regional, national, and World Series events. All of these skill levels offer your child an excellent baseball experience based on their abilities.

Our teams are formed through tryouts, a draft process, and returning players. It is our best effort to place similar skill level players on the same team. Based on skill level, teams are divided into "0" or Major League, Level 1 or AAA League, and Level 2 and 3 (both AA) League. New players who are 10 to 14-years-old must enter tryouts. On your registration form select option #1, "New Player, Enter Open Tryouts". Then you indicate the highest skill level that you and your player are willing to be selected to in the draft. As an example, if a player selects a level of 1, then during the draft process the player will only be considered for levels 1 and lower, but will not be eligible for "0" league. **PLEASE NOTE:** Players are evaluated on their ability; specifying a highest level your player is willing to play does not mean that they will be selected to that level. However, it does assure they will not be drafted above that level. Players will be drafted onto the appropriate skill level team. Below are the player options for all levels of play including "0" or Major League, Level 1 or AAA League, and Level 2 and 3 (both AA) League:

1. **New Player, Enter Open Tryouts** – Will play for any team subject to the level of play selected.
2. **Enter Open Tryouts** – Will not play for previous year's team
3. **Enter Open Tryouts** – If not drafted to a higher-level team, return to the previous year's team.
4. **Return to previous years team** – Do Not Tryout (0 League Players must attend Tryouts)

If you are a returning player and enjoyed playing on your previous year's team, select option #4, "Return to previous team". If you are a "0" League player you must attend tryouts and be retained by the Head Coach to return to your previous years team. Another option is #3 "Enter open tryouts – If not drafted to a higher level team, return to the previous year's team". This option affords the player the opportunity to enter open tryouts to be evaluated by higher level coaches as a possible draft choice, but if not selected you will be placed directly back on your previous years team. If you do not want to return back to your previous year's team select option #2 "Enter open tryouts – Do not return to previous year's team". This player must come to tryouts and is drafted accordingly. Please note that there may be age groups that have a limited number of teams available, and so players may be selected to a lower level or to teams outside of there high school area in order to meet your request. Carefully understanding these registration options will ensure a positive baseball experience for you and your player. A new Age-Cutoff date will be implemented this year in accordance with JCJBL and National sanctioning bodies. 8-AND-UNDER PROGRAM



Youth sports can be a wonderful experience.

In three years as the NJJBA 8-and-Under Program Director I have strived to create a healthy system for the children; to look at the sport through the eyes of the children, and to serve the wants and the needs of those children at play. When you're eight years old, playing sports should be almost entirely about having fun.

The 8-and-Under Program offers a wonderful foundation to start your child's experience with youth sports. The Program focuses on fundamentals...teaching and playing the game; and above all we emphasize fun. Sports is about more than winning; it is about learning, improving, and giving individual children fair opportunities to reach their full potential in life. The objective of NJJBA is to have a positive influence on the youth sport experience of your child.

The Program has steadily increased in participation since 2002 when we had 242 children sign up to play. In 2005, the 8-and-Under Program consisted of 34 teams in four leagues; a total of more than 450 kids playing baseball in the 8-and-Under Program. This included our successful first year of Tee-Ball for our 4 and 5-year-olds.

The 8-and-Under spring season typically begins in early April and ends with our season-ending tournament on a weekend in mid-June. For more detailed information regarding the 8-and-Under Program options please go to our web site (www.njjba.org) and access the 8-and-Under web pages.

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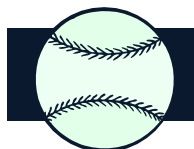
